

#### Community Updates: Office Hours, GNW Market, Pools

Beginning Mon., April 4th, 2022, the GNW Office & Silver Creek Lodge (8809 Timberwilde) is open from 9 AM to 6 PM, opening and closing one hour earlier than previously. The existing arrangement had been intended to give residents & members of the public more time to come in after typical working hours, but feedback we've received indicated that many people would find an earlier opening time more beneficial than a later closing time. This change will not affect clubs and classes that meet after 6 PM inside Silver Creek, as security will still be on site to let participants in.

Pool season is almost here, so make sure that your family has up-to-date membership IDs before Silver Creek Pool opens for weekends on Saturday, May 14th! Silver Creek weekend hours in May will be 11 AM-7 PM (with adult swim 10 AM-11 AM), and SC pool party rentals can be booked for May weekends (see p.14 for more information). At this time, Emerald Valley will not be open in May due to scheduled repairs; both pools will open for full summer hours on Friday, June 3rd. Weekend EV pool parties can be booked from that date. Weekend hours will remain 11 AM-7 PM at both pools, and weekday hours will be 11 AM-8 PM, excepting the day of the week when each pool is closed for repairs:

Monday for Emerald Valley & Tuesday for Silver Creek. With any further questions, give us a call at 210-681-2983. We're so excited for pool season, and we hope you are too!

We've greatly enjoyed having the GNW Market (formerly and also the Bandera Market) in the community each weekend. However, due to the onset of our 2022 youth soccer season and the Market organizers' decision to arrange a partial return to their Bandera Pointe location, the GNW Market will switch to a Sundays-only schedule, for April & May at the least. It will be open from 12 to 4 PM, and there will be no market on Easter Sunday, April 17th. 

## GNW Youth Soccer Comes Home

Much has been different about the past couple of years. We've seen a formidable public health challenge cause changes and disruptions in all aspects of our daily lives. This has been true here in the Great Northwest, too, with both direct & indirect ramifications: for instance, during the last three Great Northwest youth soccer seasons, our "league" was merged with that of Westover Hills Church because neither organization had enough registrants for to play separately.

While we are grateful to Westover Hills for communing with us during a difficult time, we're all the more excited to report that the Spring 2022 GNW Youth Soccer Season will return to Silver Creek Soccer Fields, with all teams comprised of GNW participants! From mid-April through late May, Saturdays will find the fields packed again with excited young athletes and the loved ones cheering them on.

While the season proper has yet to begin—the first games will be held on Friday, April 22nd and Saturday, April 23rd—

Recreation Manager Jacob Pena has been hard at work putting the many moving parts that constitute a successful soccer season into motion. Registration began in early February and ran through late March; by its end, enough participants had signed up to field 12 teams across 4 age divisions (U6, or under 6; U8; U11; and U14). Mid-March saw Mr. Pena begin lining the soccer fields, a process by which white paint is used to mark the boundaries on the pitch (the traditional term for a soccer field, FYI!). It's not something you do once and then never have to worry about again, either: "I have to line the fields at least once a week," he explains. "More if it rains."

Mr. Pena is himself a former GNW soccer participant: he grew up in the neighborhood and also served as a soccer referee, along with participation in other sports (see pg. 11 for more about him!). At a recent parents' meeting held during the last weekend in March, he spoke about his belief that playing soccer and other sports can help kids develop and exercise important capacities: not only physical health



and agility, but citizenship, sportsmanship, and a sense of their own agency. Adult spectators are challenged, too, to weigh their passion and partiality against the call to provide a good role model for young players. It's the imperfect but deeply intentional enactment of these values in practice that makes a given match live up to the sport's common moniker: "the beautiful game."

Practices began March 28th, and the schedule will run from April 22nd through Saturday, May 28th, with games each Saturday from April

## **Facility Rentals**

## THE BASICS

We have recently changed our policies on how far in advance residents are able to book spaces. Previously, reservations could not be made more than 6 months or fewer than 3 months in advance. The new policy requires only a minimum of 6 days' advance notice, or 10 days' advance notice for events with security, and we're renting out through the end of 2022. We hope this makes realizing your dreams of a special day that much easier!

In order to book a GNW space, residents must be in good standing with the Association (all assessments fully paid). Those renting their home must have a Delegation of Rights form on file in order to book a space. The resident shall be the official renter of the space and assume all responsibilities thereof, even if the event is being held on behalf of a non-resident.

When renting Callanen or Flores Hall, your payment will reserve a six-hour time slot, during which set up and tear down must be completed, in addition to the function itself. Friday events can only be held between 5 PM and midnight; weekend events can be held between 12 noon and 12 midnight. For \$100/hr, you can extend your spot (ostensibly up to 12 hours on weekends, and up to the full 7 hours on Fridays).

Finally, please note that, with regards to set up, the estimated maximum number of guests is based on the size of a space without any tables. We can provide either rectangular or circular tables, depending upon your wishes for the space.

### Let us help you create lasting memories!

#### RESERVATIONS

- Reservations must be made no later than six days prior to the event. If you will be requesting security (required when alcohol is served), the cutoff is 10 days prior to the event.
- All fees are due upon signing the Facility Usage Agreement. Accepted forms of payments are Money Orders, Checks, & Credit/Debit Cards (a 2.95% surcharge is applied for card charges).

#### **OPERATIONS DURING YOUR EVENT**

- A Party Manager will be on hand to address questions and assist with compliance.
- Member who has signed the agreement *must* be present during *the entire* duration of the party, including set-up and break-down.

#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER & POOL RENTALS**

 If stormy weather is forecast for the date & time of your pool event, you can request to reschedule. This decision must be made before the beginning of the event. Once participants enter the pool area, their rental officially begins.

#### CANCELLATIONS

 If cancelling more than 30 days before the event, you will receive a full refund. If fewer than 30 days before, you will receive your deposit back.

This figure (200 guests) is based on the size of the hall without tables. The amount of guests you will be able to comfortably accommodate will depend on the number and size of tables you elect to use.

Fee includes hall, patio, kitchen, tables and chairs, and required cleanup. Reserves 6-hour time slot (timeframe specified on contract).

#### Damage Deposit Fee: \$200

Damage inspection will be conducted after the conclusion of the event. If no damage is found, deposit will be returned within 30 days.

#### Amount Due to Reserve: \$775

#### **OPTIONAL**

#### Security: \$288

You will be required to purchase security if you plan to serve alcohol. Set Up: \$100

Fee includes hall, patio, kitchen, tables and chairs, and required cleanup. Reserves 6-hour time slot (timeframe specified on contract).

#### Damage Deposit Fee: \$200
